

Documentary evidence indicating right to work in the UK

To comply with the provisions of the Immigration Act 2016, Ypeople requires ALL applicants to produce documentary evidence indicating that they have the right to work in the UK. Where possible please submit copies of such documents with your application.

Please tick the document(s) which will be produced for verification at interview:

List A Permanent right to work in the UK

Passport

showing the holder, or a person named as the child of the holder, is a British citizen or a citizen of the UK or British Overseas Territories.

Pre-settled/Settled Status

original document showing pre-settled/settled status or ability to provide a share code

Passport

endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, has the right to abode and stay indefinitely in the UK.

Biometric Residence Permit

issued by the Home Office indicating right to stay indefinitely in the UK.

Immigration Status Document

issued by the Home Office with an endorsement indicating the right to stay indefinitely in the UK, together with an official document giving the person's name and permanent NI number.

Birth or adoption certificate

issued in the UK, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland, together with an official document giving the person's name and permanent NI number.

Certificate of registration or naturalisation

as a British citizen, together with an official document giving the person's name and permanent NI number.

List B Temporary right to work in the UK (Follow-up checks will be required)

Passport

endorsed indicating right to stay in the UK and to do the type of work in question (valid until expiry date)

Biometric Residence Permit

issued by the Home Office indicating right to stay in the UK and to do the work in question (valid until expiry date)

Immigration Status Document

containing a photograph issued by the Home Office, with a valid endorsement indicating right to stay in the UK and to do the type of work in question, together with an official document giving the person's name and permanent NI number (valid until expiry date)

Application Registration Card

issued by the Home Office stating that the holder is permitted to take the employment in question, together with a Positive Verification Notice (valid for 6 months)

Positive Verification Notice

issued by the Home Office to the employer or prospective employer, indicating that the named person may stay in the UK and is permitted to do the work in question (valid for 6 months)
